There's nothing in the news today about Tangier Island, though it's just across Chesapeake Bay from our nation's capital. If, for example, a food writer from the *Washington Post* came to sample the freshly-caught blue crabs, he might have a tough time trying to make conversation: the fishermen all speak with an accent not heard since the English Restoration period. They're all descended from 14 families who arrived from England in the 17th century.

Likewise, you probably won't read much about the Apostle Islands, off the Wisconsin coastline on Lake Superior. This astoundingly beautiful archipelago has one of the greatest concentrations of black bears in North America, and an astonishing collection of sea caves, with immense arches and delicate striated chambers.

Rediscover the Beauty of our Shores

We're pleased to offer a collection of nine unique voyages along the Eastern seaboard, around the Canadian Maritimes, down the St. Lawrence Seaway, and through the Great Lakes aboard the all-American *Yorktown*, a small cruise ship that was purposely built for North American coastal cruising, for just 138 guests. With such a limited passenger complement, the *Yorktown* is able to dock in tiny villages like Shippagan, New Brunswick, and Boothbay Harbor, Maine, which are completely inaccessible by larger vessels. They're not "tourist destinations," either: just charming small towns we've noticed for their centuries-old character, and that's such a delightful surprise in our swiftly changing culture.

And on these voyages we will rediscover American history. In late spring 2012, we'll sail from the classic whaling harbor of Gloucester, Massachusetts, around Nova Scotia to Quebec City and Montreal, visiting Alexander Graham Bell's house en route. During the summer months, we've scheduled five individual itineraries among the Great Lakes, with ports as famed as Niagara Falls and Mackinac Island—and as intimate as Sturgeon Bay, a quaint town on Wisconsin's stunning Door Peninsula. In the autumn, we'll voyage from Nantucket and Martha's Vineyard up the Hudson River to West Point; then the *Yorktown* will sail out of New Orleans to explore the historic cities and islands of the Gulf Coast, a region that offers many attractions yet is seldom visited.

We've scheduled each itinerary at the most perfect time of year—New England in late spring and early autumn; at the height of summer we'll catch the cool Great Lakes breezes; and we'll hug the southeast coast during the lingering summer. It'll be perfect for the kayaks and bikes available on board the *Yorktown* for your pleasure.

America was made in Chicago, and also in Sturgeon Bay, Wisconsin; in Richmond, Virginia, in St. Michaels, Maryland; and in New Orleans, Louisiana, too. For every famous place in American history, there are dozens of secret places that played their part. We invite you to voyage with us, and explore the America that's been there all along—just slightly beyond sight.

Each of our voyages aboard the *Yorktown* will be accompanied by study leaders who, through formal lectures and informal conversation, will introduce and explain the natural environments and the past and present cultural landscapes through which we sail. These lecturers will represent a wide range of interests and knowledge:

- Colonial historians to tell the story of our nation's founding
- Geologists to explain the origins of the Great Lakes
- Art historians to help us appreciate the Hudson River School
- Naturalists to guide our understanding of the biodiversity along our shores

Whether they are historians, geologists, artists, biologists, anthropologists, ecologists, geographers, or engineers, all of these experts will bring their special knowledge to bear on the places we visit, enhancing and enriching our experiences of them.

Some of these onboard lecturers will come to us from local and national historical and scientific organizations involved in the conservation and preservation of the natural and cultural heritage we encounter along our itineraries—speakers who have informed and entertained hundreds of our guests over the years. Others will represent the leading educational and research institutions in the country, keeping us abreast of the latest work in the academic community. No matter where they come from or what their field of study, you will find them all friendly and approachable traveling companions, eager to share their insight and knowledge.

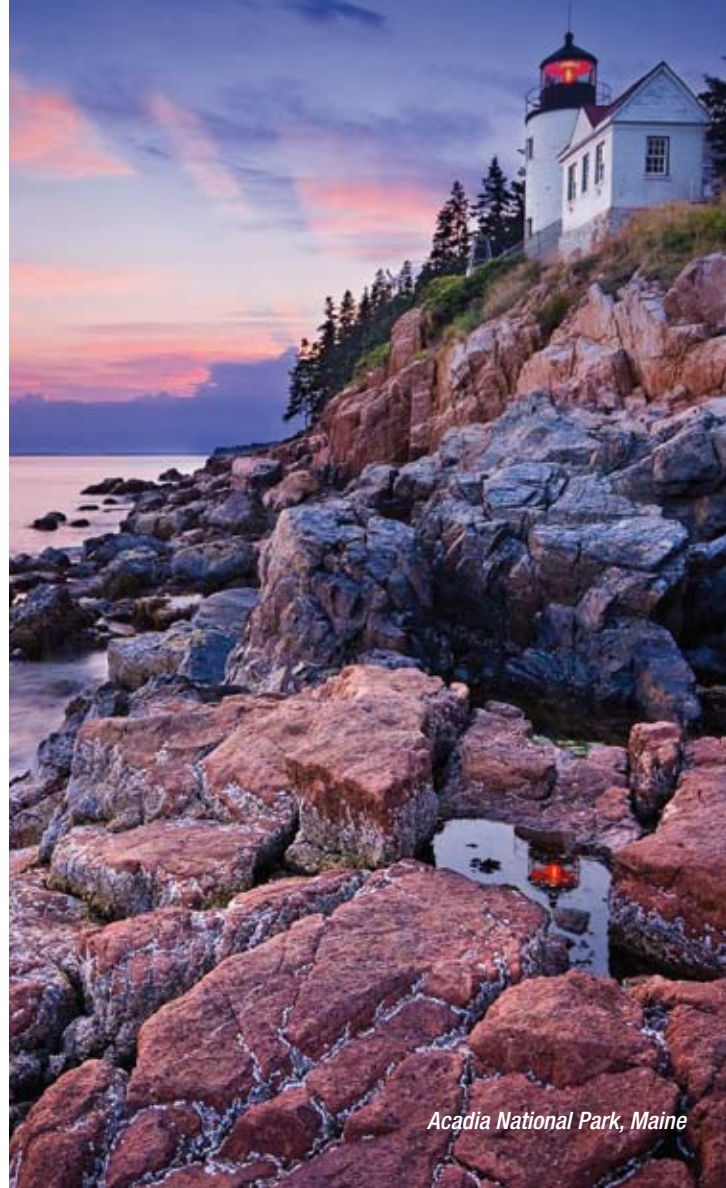

Yorktown — A Small American Cruise Ship that Makes these Itineraries Possible

The *Yorktown* is the perfect vessel for relaxed and convivial exploration of America's great coastal waterways. Built in Florida in 1988 specifically for coastal cruising and certified by the U.S. Coast Guard, the *Yorktown* flies the American flag and is staffed by friendly and experienced American officers and crew. 257 feet long, 43 feet wide, with a draft of 8 feet, the *Yorktown* is able to maneuver in secluded waterways and visit small ports that are inaccessible to larger vessels. And *Yorktown's* American registry makes it possible to operate domestic itineraries unavailable to foreign-flag ships. In addition to a large sun deck, the *Yorktown* boasts a spacious lounge for social gatherings and lectures as well as quiet space for private conversation. The ship's cuisine, served in a dining room large enough to accommodate all guests at once, emphasizes American regional culinary traditions and specialties. Both the lounge and dining room are surrounded by large picture windows that afford unobstructed views of the passing scenery. Accommodating 138 guests in 69 exterior cabins, the *Yorktown* enjoys an atmosphere of warm and relaxed informality that endears it to repeat and new guests alike.

Exploring the Great Lakes



Thousand Islands

On this voyage, discover America's most vibrant towns and vast expanses of natural splendor.

Starting from Montreal, sail through the St. Lawrence Seaway and scenic Thousand Islands to reach Lake Ontario. Spend a day visiting Toronto's many cultural sites before transiting the seven locks of the Welland Canal, the gateway to nearby Niagara Falls. Nature enthusiasts will not be disappointed with a visit to Point Pelee National Park, with its abundance of birds. Also attend a powwow on Manitoulin Island, home of the Ojibwe Native American tribe; savor the sunsets upon Lake Huron; transit the Soo Locks, known as the busiest in the world, where some 12,000 ships pass annually; and explore beautiful Mackinac Island, a Victorian-era haven at the entrance to Lake Michigan, before sailing its shores to magnificent Chicago.

First used as a means of transport by Algonquin and Iroquois tribes, the Great Lakes later became a thriving commercial hub and a heavily traveled waterway with the arrival of European settlers. And more than fifty years ago, the Great Lakes were North America's treasured summer destination. On this unique itinerary, which encompasses American and Canadian ports, travelers will witness Native American culture on Manitoulin Island; experience the majestic grandeur of the shores of Lake Superior at Whitefish Point; enjoy Mackinac Island's bygone Victorian charms; explore lovely Sheboygan and its nearby attractions; and visit the delightful town of Saugatuck, nestled along Lake Michigan's great sand dunes. A highlight of the voyage will be transiting the Soo Locks that connect Lake Huron and Lake Superior.

Also witness the natural beauty of Wisconsin’s Door Peninsula, visit Michigan’s charming Victorian-era Mackinac Island, attend a traditional Native American powwow on Manitoulin Island, and navigate the 60 islands that make up Georgian Bay Islands National Park.

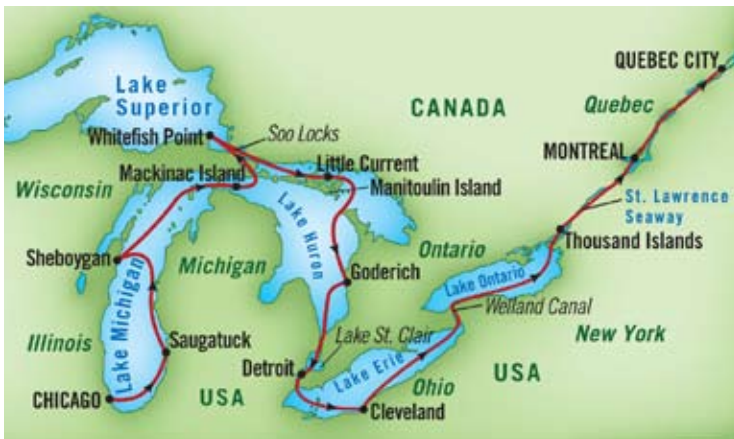

During the second half of our journey, spend a day exploring Cleveland's many sights, including the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame; pass through the complex Welland Canal; experience the natural wonder of Niagara Falls and the Thousand Islands; and navigate the historic St. Lawrence River en route to Montreal and Quebec City, with their ineffable French influences.

On this splendid voyage through Lake Erie, Lake Ontario, and the St. Lawrence River, set sail from Detroit and call at historic Cleveland. Here, visit the Great Lakes Science Center and Rock and Roll Hall of Fame or the Museum of Art and Botanical Garden. Next, pass through the seven locks of the Welland Canal into Lake Ontario and thrill to the thundering of Niagara Falls. As you traverse through the resplendent Thousand Islands, take part in lectures and discussions with onboard experts about the natural and cultural history of the places you visit. Finally, navigate the historic St. Lawrence River en route to Montreal and Quebec City.

From the St. Lawrence River to Coastal Maine

A Fall Foliage Voyage to Historic Towns & Scenic Waterways



Lunenburg, Nova Scotia

In the late days of September, the air is still warm and the breezes are just a little more audible as they pass through the changing leaves. Setting forth from idyllic Quebec City, the 138-guest *Yorktown* sails up the Saguenay River and then to Matane to explore the tranquil Jardins de Métis. Continue to the remote Gaspé Peninsula and then Prince Edward Island to see Charlottetown's old seaport, Prince House, and Prince Edward Island National Park. Also explore the pristine countryside of Nova Scotia, including Cape Breton Island; Sherbrooke, a living portrait of 19th-century Nova Scotian life; and the UNESCO World Heritage site of Lunenburg. The passage culminates with calls to Maine's Bar Harbor, Acadia National Park, and Boothbay Harbor.

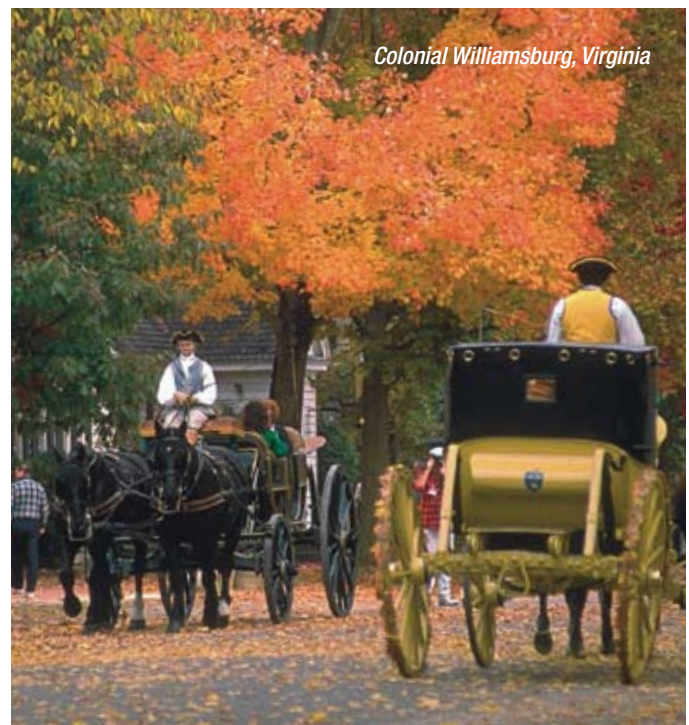

On this voyage exploring the waterways around the Chesapeake Bay, visit distinctive locations that offer an intriguing portrait of American history, architecture, and culture from the colonial era to the present. Departing from Philadelphia, venture through the Chesapeake and Delaware Canal to Annapolis, where you will learn about its naval heritage. Then visit St. Michaels, home to some of the world’s best seafood; and Tangier Island, an isolated fishing community whose inhabitants speak an English Restoration-era dialect. Also see Revolutionary War and Civil War sites in history-steeped Richmond; pay a visit to Colonial Williamsburg, America’s premier living museum; and discover George Washington’s stately home at Mount Vernon. Conclude in historic Alexandria or enjoy an optional extension to our nation’s capital.

Historic Cities & Natural Treasures



The Spanish explored the Gulf Coast 500 years ago, yet to most American travelers it is undiscovered territory. We invite you to discover an unspoiled region of America where the beaches are pristine, the coastal islands are teeming with wildlife, and the historic and cultural sites are among the most important in the North or South. Explore New Orleans and Mobile; both cities were founded by the French early in the 18th century, and both still celebrate their French and Creole heritage. Less well-known but equally fascinating is Apalachicola, an enchanting waterfront town renowned for its 19th-century architecture. Also sail to two nature preserves: Horn Island, where the palmetto forests are home to more than 280 species of birds, and the St. Vincent National Wildlife Refuge, habitat of such rare species as red wolves and bald eagles.

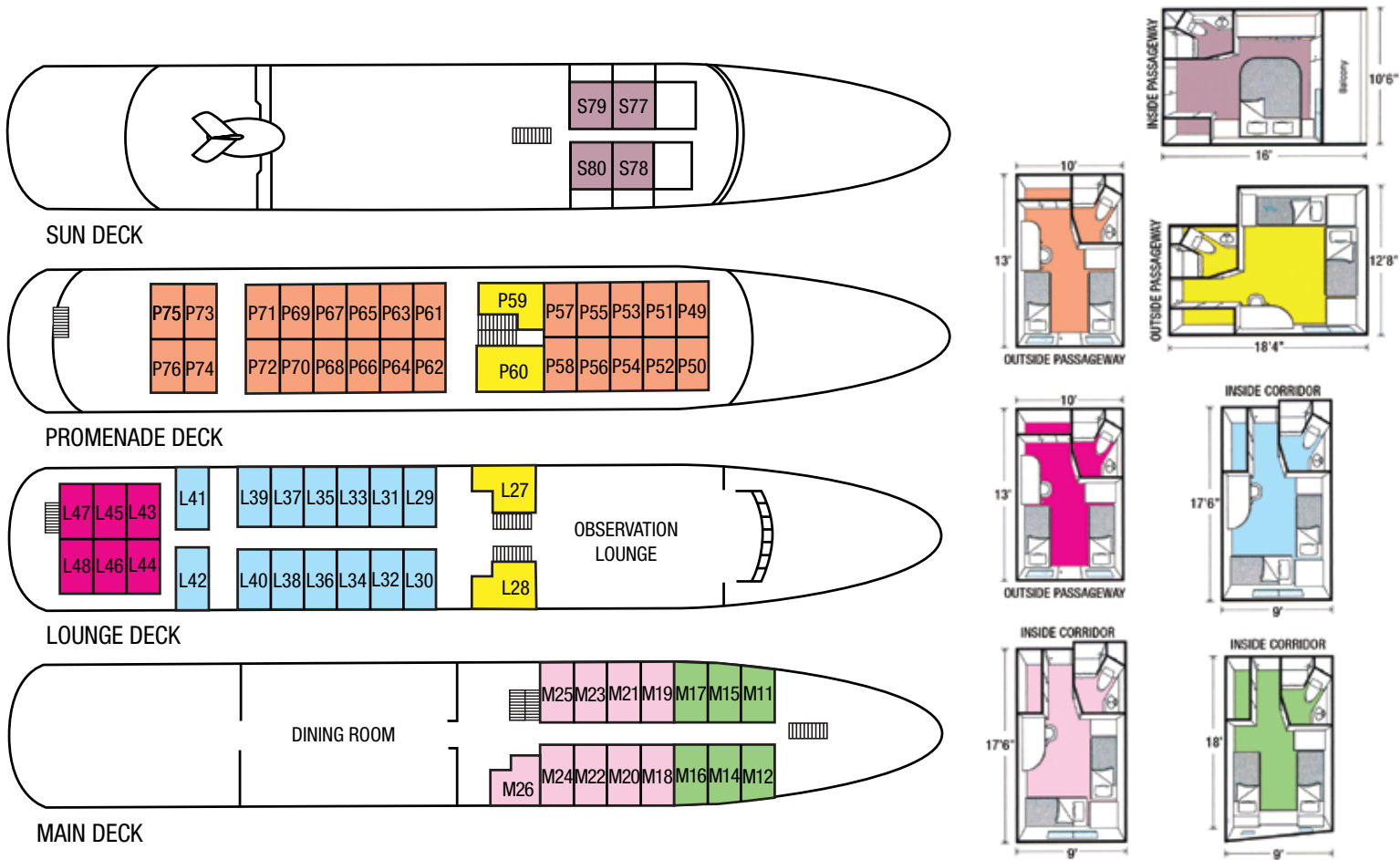
